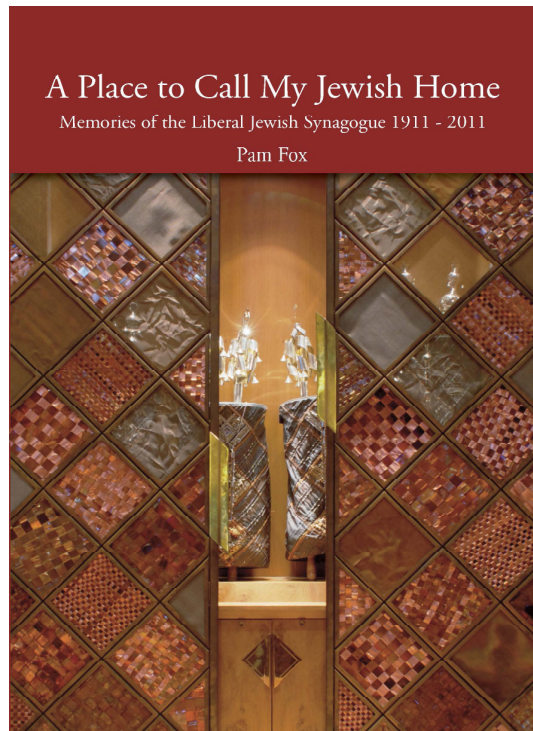

The book was conceived as part of our centenary celebrations. It brings the synagogue's history vividly to life through the eyes and in the words of congregants, rabbis, lay leaders and professional staff.

It draws on an extensively researched range of interviews, talks, lectures, newspaper articles, letters, memoirs, and other archive materials. It provides a chronological history, covers key themes and issues in the development, of the synagogue, and presents the fascinating personal memories of a cross section of members.



Michael Grade, a member of the LJS congregation, inspired the book's title. He coined the phrase as a mark of his deep feelings for the synagogue whilst paying tribute to the man who helped him regain his faith in Judaism, Rabbi John Rayner.

The book has been written and researched by Pam Fox who joined the LJS as a 'Friend' and who co-chaired the committee which organised the synagogue's centenary celebrations.

The book was launched at the *Shabbaton* held on 3 December.
